



MetroWest Boston offers fantastic tours for couples, from the romantic to the adventurous. We recommend the following as one amazing itinerary suitable for groups:

## Couples Tour

**DAY 1:** Start your day with a visit to the **Massachusetts Horticultural Society's Garden at Elm Bank**, a horticultural jewel that blends historic and contemporary into a place of beauty, contemplation and exploration. Wander the gardens, then take a workshop in horticultural history, gardening, or a hands-on art class.



After your garden tour, shop your way through the exclusive brands found in the **Natick Mall**, the largest mall in New England, ending at **LightMoon**. This whimsical candle bar will teach you to make your own custom natural soy candle, complete with a scent that's meaningful to you and enhanced with dried flowers, crystals, soy melts and other surprises.

In the afternoon, take your group to **Happy Goats Farm** for a hilarious **goats yoga class** (taught by certified instructors), where baby goats will snuggle up, jump on you, and sometimes gently nibble clothes. A unique experience that will have everyone talking!



In the evening, head to **Heritage of Sherborn** to enjoy the rich, satisfying flavors of New England at this farm-to-table Gastro-Pub. Dine inside their historic restaurant or outdoors beside their cozy firepits. Combine dinner with an educational and entertaining **private beer, wine or cocktail tasting**.



**DAY 2:** Book a private cooking class for your group at **Duck Soup**, who offer everything from a British Afternoon Tea workshop to pasta-making classes to French Bistro cooking, and more! Everything is provided, and experience isn't necessary for this tasty outing. While there, be sure to pick up some **Goodnow Farms Chocolate** in the Duck Soup shop--the most decorated chocolate maker in North America produces their small-batch bars just up the road.

In the afternoon, visit **Leduc Art & Antiques** to wander their French-style boutique offering European, American, and Asian antiques & hand-made artifacts by local artists. You can also book a special event there, such as their "In Conversation with Antiques" psychometry session where their guest-medium, Genevieve Hackett, will read objects through the power of touch.



Cap off your romantic tour of MetroWest Boston with dinner, a wander of the shops, and an exploration of the public art in the **Franklin Cultural District**. After dinner, catch a theater, music or dance performance at **THE BLACK BOX** theater, known for bringing in both regional and national performers.
