

# Sample MetroWest Boston 2-3 day itinerary:

# American Heritage Museum (Hudson, MA)

Start your tour in the depths of a WWI trench listening to a nurse's first-hand account from the Front while bombs explode above you and the ground begins to shake. The Heritage's astounding collection of historic aircraft, tanks, armored vehicles, classic automobiles and rare relics from the Revolutionary War through WWII to today, including immersive exhibits, living history events and over a dozen one-of-a-kind artifacts. Arrange a once-in-a-lifetime ride in a World War II Sherman tank or learn to drive a M24 Chaffee tank.



# Longfellow's Wayside Inn (Sudbury, MA)

After your museum experience, head to Wayside Inn for a delicious lunch. The inn began life in 1716, making it the oldest inn in America. Explore the early 1800's Old Barn, now a farm stand with displays of antique farming tools and other artifacts; the Grist Mill, a reproduction of the 1700's original built by Henry Ford, founder of Ford Motors, in 1929; the Redstone Schoolhouse, built in 1798 and featured in the poem "Mary Had a Little Lamb"; as well as the Martha-Mary Chapel, Longfellow Memorial Garden and Josephine's Pond.

# New England Botanic Garden at Tower Hill (Boylston, MA)

Enjoy this 200-acre four-season botanical paradise with 18 distinct garden spaces, preserved woodlands, and miles of walking trails. Tower Hill offers educational programs, exhibitions, seasonal special events and a lovely garden shop and café. Many paths are handicap accessible.





### Hopkinton Center for the Arts (Hopkinton, MA)

Visit one of the region's largest performing and visual arts centers. HCA includes a rotating gallery of regional work, a wealth of art workshops and special events, engaging lectures and educational programs, and indoor and outdoor music, dance & theater performances.



#### Christa McAuliffe Center (Framingham, MA)

Step into a world of science and discovery at the Christa McAuliffe Center! With a cutting-edge planetarium and dynamic Challenger Simulation Lab, open only to groups, visitors can take on mission challenges to launch a spacecraft and then work cooperatively to bring it home again. Stargazing events and science-themed lectures are also available.

#### Lookout Farm (South Natick, MA)

Head to Lookout Farm, where you can pick peaches, apples, nectarines, and pumpkins in season, followed by a flight of their farm-brewed beers or hard cider and a lunch of their famous open-pit BBQ fare. There's outdoor seating in summer months or a cozy brewhouse in winter, both featuring live music with local bands year-round. The farm shop sells not only Lookout's own produce, but jams, jellies, and other delightful delicacies--as well as stellar cider donuts, a New England favorite! Lookout Farm is one of 15 breweries in MetroWest; many offer behind-the-scenes tours and tastings.





#### Southwick's Zoo (Mendon, MA)

New England's largest zoo is home to 950+ animals in naturalistic habitats. Feed giraffes, white rhinos, and sloths with their exclusive **Animal Encounters** program. Enjoy live shows, a carousel, maze, train ride, the Soaring Eagle Zipline, and Skyfari Sky Ride. The Zoo puts on seasonal special events, including the **Great Jack o' Lantern Journey** in October and **Winter Wonderland** in December—both with evening entertainment, light shows and displays, and more. The zoo's sit-down, upscale restaurant, **Galliford**'s, can accommodate group dining.

# GlenPharmer Distillery (Franklin, MA)

This premier destination distillery and tasting room, housed in a historic mill building, offers behind-the-scenes tours and creative, chef-inspired cuisine. A guided tasting allows groups to try spirits that are familiar but with a uniquely New England flair, like Bog, their vodka infused with local cranberries, or Brookdale Gin, infused with 11 local botanicals.





#### Level99 (Natick, MA)

Let your group challenge one another at Level99, a sprawling real-life game world with over 50 rooms of physical and mental challenges. Great for teens through adults!



On 100 wooded lakefront acres, this cozy alpine-style lodge is perfect for groups to indulge in outdoor activities...kayak on the lake or swim from the beach, hike in the woods, play horseshoes or bocce on the lawn, try your skill at their ropes course, or create friendly competition with a game of tennis, volleyball, softball or soccer. Or simply pull an Adirondack chair up to a fire pit and roast a few marshmallows.
