Lodging

With 5,422 rooms in 44 hotels, we offer lodging to fit any traveler, from budget to luxury, and from rustic and cozy to fabulous and funky. Most properties have event space for groups and free onsite bus parking, and all are just minutes from exciting attractions. With an average daily rate of just \$141/night, our hotels are an affordable alternative to higher-priced Boston, but close enough to the city to visit easily.

Arts & Culture

MetroWest Boston includes a wealth of arts attractions, all within 30 minutes of our hotels, including:

- A plethora of performing arts venues offering live music, dance, and theater productions, such as Hopkinton Center for the Arts, The Umbrella Arts Center, The Center for Arts Natick (TCAN), the Hanover Theatre, The Vets, and many more.
- World-class museums with amazing collections of old masters and cutting-edge modern favorites, including the Danforth Art Museum, Worcester Art Museum, Attleboro Arts Museum, and deCordova Sculpture Park and Museum, plus easy access to Boston's Museum of Fine Arts, Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum, and others.
- Four State-designated **Cultural Districts** rich in performing 8 visual arts, unique boutiques, award-winning restaurants, and historic sites.
- Cultural, community, and seasonal fairs, festivals, and special events.


History

- The American Heritage Museum, an extraordinary museum of military and world history, featuring one-of-a-kind historic aircraft, tanks, armored vehicles, classic automobiles and rare relics from the Revolutionary War to today, with immersive exhibits and living history events.
- 19,000+ artifacts at the Framingham History Center, including precious objects rarely seen in other museum collections that reflect moments of great regional, national, or international importance.
- Longfellow's Wayside Inn, the oldest inn in America, with a rich literary and historical past.
- Old Sturbridge Village, a perfectly recreated 1830s New England town complete with costumed historians, seasonal events, and onsite dining.
- Dozens of local history museums, historical sites, and historic homes.







Sports & Recreation

We boast a huge range of golf and disc golf courses, tennis courts, pickleball, ice rinks, soccer fields, and more! Outdoor enthusiasts can hike, bike, crosscountry ski, snow shoe, kayak, swim, and fish their way across the region. MetroWest Boston offers outdoor beauty for any activity level, including:

- Over 53 miles of walking 8 biking paths along 4 different Massachusetts Rail Trail systems, as well as numerous other parks, paths, and hiking areas.
- 8 state park recreation areas, including **Hopkinton State Park**, with boat rentals on the lake, swimming beaches, fishing, and trails for hiking, crosscountry skiing, snowmobiling, horseback riding, and more.
- Cutting-edge sports venues including Bosse and Clock Tower for pickleball,
 Beach House indoor volleyball, Dr. Green's & KOHR golf simulators, etc.
- Spectacular gardens at Garden in the Woods, New England Botanical Garden at Tower Hill, the Garden at Elm Bank, and the wildlife sanctuaries of Mass Audubon and others.
- Plus, an enormous variety of indoor entertainment and amusement park
 options, including go karts, bowling, laser tag, trampoline parks, ninja gyms,
 mini golf, axe throwing, ropes courses, arcades, bumper cars, billiards,
 escape rooms, immersive video gaming, art workshops, casinos, and more!

Stadiums & Arenas

MetroWest Boston is 15-45 minutes from many major sports and event venues, including:

- Gillette Stadium, host of the New England Patriots NFL team, the 2026
 FIFA World Cup and the New England Revolution Major League Soccer team, as well as special events from monster trucks to major concerts.
- Fenway Park, home to the MLB Boston Red Sox, the NHL Winter Classic hockey tournament, major concerts, college football, and special events.
- TD Garden, home of the NBA Boston Celtics and the NHL Boston Bruins teams, plus host to concerts from Madonna to André Rieu.
- Providence's Amica Mutual Pavilion, host to a wide variety of sporting events, concerts, family shows, ice shows, movies and more.

Shopping

Find gourmet foods to designer clothes, jewelry to handmade toys, all within a half hour drive. Browse the unique boutiques in one of our quaint New England towns like Hudson or Natick.
